Dues: Thanks to all who've paid! Note that only \$150 is due if paid by April 30th (\$200 thereafter). Delinquency occurs on July 1st.

- Ongoing projects:

- -- We've made known our desires for the old sewage lagoon area (lot 77). Obviously, we'd like to maximize usage and minimize liability, but the city has yet to make a decision on its disposition.
- -- Front landscaping will get an overdue facelift. We'll finalize the plant & stone work within a week or so, and hope to begin in a month. More items (ex: sod) will need to be budgeted next year.
- -- Sign and sign post painting was done last year. Lamp post painting will be completed this year as budgeted at the last annual meeting.
- -- POTHOLES! We contacted the city for repairs, and asked what it takes to get them (especially Rebekah) resurfaced standing by. We encourage you to voice your displeasure to our alderman, David Wallace, <u>dwallace@obms.us</u>

- Areas of focus:

- -- Parking isn't allowed anywhere besides your driveway/garage. Yes, shuffling extra vehicles is irritating, but please don't park off pavement.
- -- Several mailboxes are in need of paint and/or repair. Standards are outlined on our website for DIY'ers, or a recommended vendor is listed.
- -- The city won't pick up large electronics; you may dispose/recycle them at a

trailer on the back side of the city Fleet Services building on Old 78 (just west of the police station).

-- Trailers/boats/lawn equip/etc. cannot be stored on property unless out of sight

- Public service announcements:

-- Beginning **October 1, 2021**, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL ID-compliant driver's license, state-issued enhanced driver's license, or another acceptable form of ID (ex: passport) to fly within the United States.
